## ITINERARY:

### Mon./July 23:

Morning departure from our pick-up points. First stop will be the Shrine of **“Our Lady of Martyrs”**, this site was once a 17th century Mohawk village called Ossernenon where three Jesuit missionaries were martyred during the 1640s. Father Isaac Jogues, René Goupil, a Jesuit brother, and John Lalonde, a lay missionary, are the only canonized American martyrs. Together with five Jesuit priests killed in the native missions of Canada, they are known as the North American Martyrs. The beatified "Lily of the Mohawks," Blessed **“Kateri Tekakwitha”**, was born here in 1656. In 1884, the site was purchased from a local farmer by Father Joseph Loyzance, S.J., pastor of St. Joseph's Church in Troy, NY. He called it "Our Lady of Martyrs" for the Blessed Mother who stood at the cross of Jesus. The first Mass was celebrated on the Feast of the Assumption, August 15, 1885, the 243rd anniversary of Father Jogues arrival at the village as a captive. Short tour of the Shrine followed by Mass and a short lunch. Departure for Canada. Dinner and overnight in Montreal.

### Tue./July 24:

Today we begin visiting the largest church in Canada, the **“Oratory of St. Joseph”**. The Oratory of St. Joseph was founded in 1904 by **“Blessed Brother André”**. He built a small chapel near the Notre-Dame College where he could receive those in need. He implored them to pray to St. Joseph, who would hear their pleas and address their illnesses and sorrow. In 1924 the construction of a great basilica commenced. The project wasn't finished until 1967. Blessed Brother André demanded the basilica be named for St. Joseph to whom he attributes all the miracles he's performed. We will visit the Oratory and Mass in a private chapel. Afternoon guided bus tour of Montreal. Dinner and overnight in Montreal

### Wed./July 25:

Today after breakfast we will transfer to the **“Basilica of Notre Dame”** for our Mass in the chapel of **“Our Lady of the Sacred Heart”**. Montreal's magnificent Basilica of Notre Dame (**Basilica of our Lady**) is a stunning example of the fine ecclesiastic architecture of the 19th century. After Mass we will have a guided tour of the Basilica. Late morning departure from Montreal for our bus ride to Quebec City. Afternoon bus guided tour of the **“Old City of Quebec”**. Dinner and overnight in Quebec City.

### Thu./July 26:

Our day begins with breakfast at our hotel and transfer to the **“Shrine of St Anne”**. St Anne is a place of many healings, St Anne, mother of Our Blessed Lady, is patron saint of Quebec. We will visit the magnificent Basilica of St Anne, see the miraculous statue of St Anne holding the Virgin Mary in her arms, the chapel of the Holy Steps. Admire the 240 stained glass windows, see the relic of St Anne presented by **“Pope John XXIII”** in 1960. We are privileged to be in these spiritual grounds on the feast day of St. Anne. We will join the many pilgrims from around the world for the Solemn Mass. In the afternoon we will follow the famous life size Stations of the Cross. Dinner and overnight in Quebec City.

### Fri./July 27:

Early morning departure from Quebec City and on our way to Albany, we will stop at the **“Shrine of Our Lady of the Cape”**, the largest Marian shrine in North America. A miraculous bridge of ice enabled its construction, (its first miracle) followed by the miracle of the eyes. See the new Basilica, Sanctuary Chapel, Miraculous Statue and Bridge of the Rosaries. The shrine is noted for the many pilgrims who come here in search of strength and courage. On September 10, 1984, **“Pope John Paul II”** celebrated an outdoor Mass at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Cape, and said: **“This Marian pilgrimage is an immense grace accorded to the Canadian people. May the river of the prayerful never run dry here.”** May all Canadians return to the recitation of the family Rosary, so that the Church in Canada will recover its splendour and vitality of the past! We will celebrate Mass and afternoon drive to Albany. Dinner and overnight in Albany.

### Sat./July 28:

This morning after breakfast we will take a short drive to LEE, MA and here you'll have free time to shop at **“Lee Premium Outlets”**. The outlets have over 60 designer stores. Afternoon transfer to the **“Shrine of Divine Mercy”**. This Shrine offers many opportunities for inspiration and devotion. Pilgrims find refreshment of soul at Mass, confession, the 3 o'clock Chaplet of The Divine Mercy, and personal adoration of the Eucharist. We invite you to stroll throughout the beautiful grounds. In this Shrine you'll have the opportunity to take part in the Holy Hour, Mass and Divine Mercy Chaplet. Dinner at a local restaurant and return back home.
